Programma del Corso

Struttura del Corso

Il corso è organizzato in tre sezioni (1) La globalizzazione, lo stato e le sue trasformazioni e le teorie della globalizzazione della politica (2) Il sistema internazionale, la globalizzazione e il ruolo della società civile internazionale (3) Aspetti politici dei processi di europeizzazione e globalizzazione.

The module examines the sociology of contemporary international relations with particular reference to processes of widening of the international arena and processes

of redefinition of the functions of the state. With specific reference to the European dimension, the module examines the role of organised civil society and its interaction with other levels of governance. The module is structured in three sections. (1) Globalisation, the state and its transformations, and theories of global politics; (2) Globalisation, the international system and the role of international civil society; (4) Political Dimensions of Europeanisation and Globalisation.
